CRUISIN' FOR CHARITY

On September 10, the Goombahs Car Club hosted their **10th Annual Cruise for a Cause** in Downtown Willow Glen to benefit Second Harvest. The event featured over 600 cars, San Jose Sharks mascot SJ Sharkey, and KC Mathieu of KC's Paint Shop and formerly of Discovery Channel's *Fast N' Loud*.

KC shared, "Supporting Cruise for a Cause is a no brainer. It's a one-day show, 600+ cars, helping local small businesses, and collecting a ton of donations for a great cause." He continues:



“We all can do so much to help end hunger through small actions—it’s important to me, to not only support Second Harvest Food Bank, but expose my kids to the positive experience of working together to address the needs of others.”

The first Cruise for a Cause was held near the height of the Great Recession. “10 years ago, the economy was down, and Second Harvest Food Bank put an ad out saying they were low on canned foods and funds,” recalls Jeff Cimoli, President of the Goombahs Car Club. Since the club was a year old at the time, they wanted

to host a car show. **“We figured that Second Harvest needed some help, so why not do a combination - help Second Harvest and do our car show, too.”**

The event has grown significantly from its humble beginnings, going from one parking lot and 50 cars, to stretching across Downtown Willow Glen with hundreds of cars filling the neighborhood's many parking lots. Cruise for a Cause is now the largest free car show in Northern California.

“When I came into this club and found out what it does and what the cause was, it does something to pump you up,” shared Howard Owen, a member of the Goombahs. “We are running around and seeing people drop in cans of food in the barrel and watching money change hand in the booths for donations and all that type of stuff and we can say ‘Yeah, we’re doing something.’”

During the Food Bank's 2017 Make Hunger History awards event, the Goombahs received the Community Champion Award as one of the top community fundraiser groups. Since 2008 **the Goombahs have provided the equivalent of over 130,000 meals to our community.**
